## Committee Report on USACE/ACEC KS/ACEC MO Liaison Meeting

### June 30, 2021 Meeting Minutes

USACE Kansas City District (NWK) Program Update (Mike Coates, USACE Chief Program Management)

- FY21 budget is under \$1B (50% of this budget is due to mega projects though)
- NWK budget will trend downward to \$529 MM by FY24
- Civil Works Projects – FY21 budget is \$534MM due to the KC levees project
- Manhattan, KS Levee Raise – potential A/E support for a road closure
- Lower MO Flood Risk Study – potential A/E support for spin off studies
- Upper Turkey Creek – potential for A/E support
- MO River Navigation Study – part of a bank stabilization program; potential for A/E support
- KC Levees – all projects awarded; pump station project is well underway
- MILCON – FY21 budget is \$300MM; budget could pick up over the next 4 years (FY25) as the mega projects complete
- SRM – 18 actions @ \$45MM
- Energy efficiency projects
- VA BIM Legionella Study – potential for A/E support
- MIL IDIQ Contracts
- NWK sharing work with Baltimore and Sacramento since NWK has ample capacity
- VA Hospital in St. Louis – currently in conceptual design; no acquisition strategy yet; peel off some pieces of the project for small business participation
- HTRW – mostly stable; \$100-\$150 MM year

NWK Leadership Changes

- Colonel Travis Rayfield – New NWK District Commander
- Major John Chambers – New NWK Deputy District Commander
- John Holm – Current Chief of Engineering, retiring effective July 29
- Eric Shumate – New Chief of Engineering

USACE Reconstitution Plan

- Currently 50% of staff in office M-R; Friday is telework day
- Soon 100% of staff in office 3 days a week and the other two days are telework
- Mission will drive office attendance

Cybersecurity Maturity Model (CMMC)

- NWK a few years out from implementing
- A/E's ability to protect Federal Contract Information (FCI) and Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI)
- Will be included in future contracts
- Might be required to obtain a certificate after contract award
- FY26 – all contracts will have CMMC level
- Currently unknown what level of security is required for a typical contract
- Cost – unknown, but will be considered an allowed cost
- Certifications good for 3 years

SAME Update

- Industry Day planned in the fall
- Venue and format have not been determined
